This makes playing the hymn much easier for the new organist or organists who are short on time to practice and prepare the hymns each week. And it also gives confidence to the new organist. To fulfill the needs of organists to accompany hymns, we offer two books with the hymns scored for organ - meaning that when an organist plays. We also provide suggested stop registration for all 295 hymns, once again, to give new organists suggestions that assist them in playing. For those who also play piano and keyboards for rehearsals and Mass,

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this book and the standard ORGAN EDITION can be very helpful as well. Hymnals are written for singers, not for organists pianists or keyboard players!

Its current hymn book was published in 2000 and this new supplement contains some 200 hymns, songs and liturgical settings reflecting the best of church music to emerge since the compilation of the most recent edition of the Church Hymnal. The selection includes many hymns and songs, plus a new setting for the Eucharist, short songs and chants – alleluias, kyries, and blessings, a number of items in the Irish language, music from the world church and some completely new compositions and arrangements. Two years in preparation, the selection has been overseen by a team of parish and cathedral musicians and clergy and has been tested in local parishes. It is fully authorised by the Synod of the Church of Ireland and will be launched at the 2015 Synod. The editorial team includes Bishop Harold Miller (Chair), Peter Thompson, Janet Maxwell and others.

The Chorale Book for England is a profoundly rich, valuable book, both the words and the music. This is a collection of 200 German hymns translated into English by Catherine Winkworth, with German hymn tunes edited by William Sterndale Bennett and Otto Goldschmidt. Winkworth published the first volume of *Lyra Germanica* in 1855 (London: Longman, Brown, Green, and Longmans, 1855), and the "Second Series" in 1858. These were her translations of German hymns into English, a treasure of true worship. The *Lyra*

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Germanica Series I had 103 hymns, arranged around the church calendar; Series II had 121 hymns, arranged according to subjects. The Chorale Book for England was a set of German hymns translated by C.W. in her *Lyra Germanica* (and also other hymns not in the *Lyra Germanica*), with music scores-chiefly from German hymnbooks-edited by William Sterndale Bennett and Otto Goldschmidt. Since its introduction in 1986, The New English Hymnal, containing 542 items, has been adopted in virtually every Anglican cathedral, many Roman Catholic cathedrals and in well over 1000 parishes. In addition to a broad range of general hymns, it offers hymns for feasts, seasons and saints' days; office hymns for the liturgical year; an enlarged eucharistic section; a selection of responsorial psalms. The New English Hymnal is available in the following editions, all hardback, bound in green cloth.

The Parson's Handbook, first published in 1899, is Dearmer's brotherly advice to fellow churchmen about the correct way to conduct proper and fitting English worship, concerned with general principles of ritual and ceremonial, but the emphasis is squarely on the side of art and beauty in worship. He was the author of books and pamphlets on church art and history and editor of the hymnbook Songs of Praise in 1931. The Parson's Handbook ran into many editions, and he devised The English Hymnal to which composers Ralph Vaughan Williams and Gustav Holst contributed. In The Parson's Handbook, Dearmer states in the introduction that his goal is to help in "remedying the lamentable confusion, lawlessness, and vulgarity which are conspicuous in the Church at this time." What follows is an exhaustive delineation, sparing no detail, of the young priest's ideas on how liturgy can be conducted in a

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proper Catholic and English manner.

It describes how they celebrated the great events of life: birth, coming of age, and marriage, and gave comfort in sickness and death. A final chapter covers the English Reformation in the sixteenth century

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and shows how, alongside its changes, much that went on in parish churches remained as before.

Used together, the New English Hymnal and New English Praise provide a parish or school with everything they need to keep every celebration of the calendar, whether they use traditional or contemporary language (or both) forms in their worship.

Jay Hulme is an award-winning transgender poet, performer, educator and speaker.
